


Maintenance Committee Update

• Leaf Collection

- The week November 23rd will be the last leaf collection for this year. We intend to pick it up in the spring.
- Transformer Replacements
 - The final round of Transformer replacements will begin Monday December 1st,
 2025. Two(2) of the five(5) have been installed so far.
 - o Power is scheduled to be off in the following sections for up to 2 weeks:
 - Rec Center Lots B196 B217 B065 B139 B152 B155 B196 B217
 - Lots on Sunshine Lots on Ice Cream Campfire D298 D342
 - o Beaver, Ice cream and Hollow log transformers to be replaced in this order.
 - o Please consider this a fluid situation and continue to be patient as you all have.
 - As they work on this project, they find issues that need to be addressed and take care of them as they go.
 - We (SRCA) truly appreciate everyone's grace and consideration during this time period.
- Other Maintenance activities
 - o Our spare transformer could be leaking (We will follow up with Wright electric on that subject)
 - Rec hall electrical panel issues being addressed
 - We had to order four(4) new 200amp breakers to replace the existing150amp breakers.
 - This should help with reducing the electrical overloads in the rec hall due to too many things plugged in at once.
- Next Maintenance Committee Meeting
 - Loosely planning on Saturday March 14th for the first meeting of 2026. An official notice will go out well in advance.

Ways and Means Committee

As it was reported in the October newsletter, the committee met with our developers, Vinny and Jim, to review the prototype that they developed for the electronic viewing (via TV's) of our camp's events including our calendar of events, a message board, scrolling Memories and Featured items. The information on the TV is taken directly from our website. Updates or changes to the calendar will occur real time - when the office makes a change, the TV's display will change too.



Here is an example of what the display will look like. This photo does not show but that we will have a QR code added so a member can scan the code and have it on their phone. We will have two stations for the TVs. The TV's will be 55". Of course, having these TVs require the internet so our choice of placement was limited by where we could get internet service. One will be installed on the outside wall of the Rec Hall somewhere between the doors and laundry mat. The other will be at the front playground area by the metal fence facing the road. There is a large grassy area where golf carts can pull up and view.

At the November Board meeting, we set up the TV so those attending could see.

The equipment needed will be ordered this week and we hope to have the TVs installed and ready to go for spring. I thank all those on the committee who started this project, all those who supported Ways and Means through our sales, and Vinny and Jim for their ideas and developing the displays.

Mental Health Minute

The Impact of the Holidays on Mental Health

Mental health encompasses our emotional, psychological, and social well-being, influencing how we think, feel, and act in daily life. The holiday season, often portrayed as a time of joy and celebration, can paradoxically exacerbate mental health challenges for many individuals. High expectations for perfect gatherings, financial pressures from gift-giving and travel, and the amplification of loneliness for those without close connections can lead to increased stress, anxiety, and depression. Seasonal affective disorder (SAD), a type of depression linked to reduced sunlight in winter months, further compounds these issues, making holidays a trigger point where underlying mental health concerns surface more prominently.

The effects of holidays on behavior, well-being, attitude, and physical health are multifaceted. Behaviorally, people might withdraw socially or, conversely, engage in overindulgence in food, alcohol, or shopping as coping mechanisms, leading to regret or strained relationships. Well-being can suffer from disrupted routines, such as irregular sleep patterns due to festivities or travel, which erode emotional resilience. Attitudes may shift toward cynicism or irritability amid family conflicts or unmet expectations, fostering a negative outlook that persists beyond the season. Physically, the stress response can manifest as headaches, digestive issues, weakened immune function, or exacerbated chronic conditions like hypertension, as the body's cortisol levels spike from holiday demands, highlighting the interconnectedness of mental and physical health.

Prevailing thoughts in mental health advocacy emphasize the critical importance of checking in on family, friends, and neighbors during the holidays. Experts from organizations like the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) and the World Health Organization (WHO) stress that a simple conversation or gesture can uncover hidden struggles, reducing isolation and potentially preventing crises like suicidal ideation, which spikes during this period. This proactive approach fosters community support, normalizes discussions about mental health, and encourages empathy, reminding us that holidays are an opportunity to strengthen bonds rather than assume everyone is thriving.

For millions of people, the holidays are not the "most wonderful time of the year"—they are the hardest. Grief, loneliness, financial strain, family tension, and shorter days can quietly overwhelm even those who seem fine on the surface. A single caring check-in can interrupt that spiral and remind someone they are not alone.

So please, this week and throughout the season, reach out. Send the text you've been meaning to send. Call the relative you usually only see on social media. Knock on your neighbor's door with cookies or just a "How are you—really?" You don't need the perfect words; you only need to show you care. One small connection can make a life-saving difference. Let's look out for each other.
